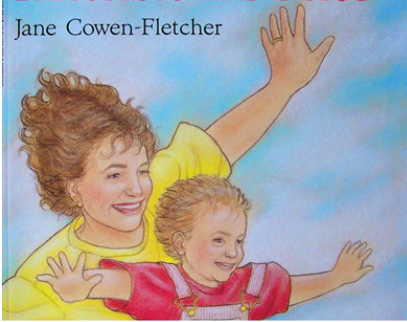

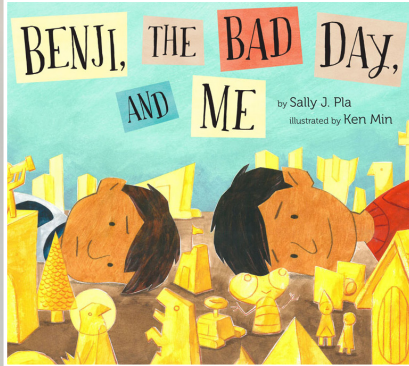
A young child enjoys the day on his mom's lap in her wheelchair.

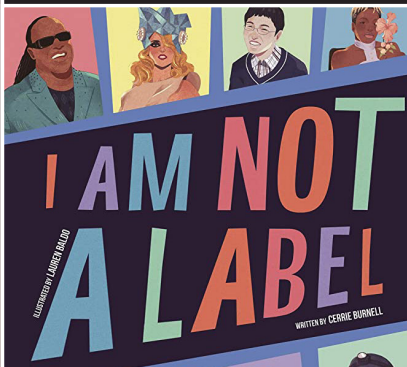


Each page introduces a new character, who shares about their disability, followed by a question children without disabilities can relate to.

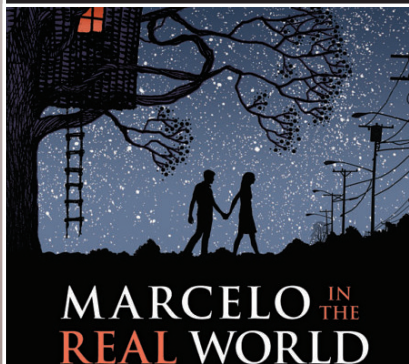


This book helps children identify heroes with disabilities to look up to.
